

ENGLISH

Guided Reading using Oxford Reading Tree and other books from the school reading scheme
Phonics – revise phonemes and graphemes introduced in Reception
Word boxes (blending and segmenting practice)
Reading tricky words
Handwriting practice – correct letter formation (lower case letters and our names)
Power of Reading – **Grace and Family** by Mary Hoffman
Writing sentences with capital letters, finger spaces and full stops
Grammar – correct use of capital letters
Know the names and order of letters in the alphabet
Learn, perform and write poems about Autumn

MATHS

Count to at least 10, forwards and backwards, beginning with 0 or 1, or from any given number
Count, read and write numbers to at least 10 in numerals and words
Identify and represent numbers using objects and pictures including the number line
Use the language of: equal to, more than, less than (fewer), most and least
Say the number which is one more or one less than a given number
Count in multiples of twos
Add and subtract numbers to 10
Read and record number sentences involving addition (+), subtraction (-) and equals (=) signs
Solve one step problems that involve addition and subtraction using objects and pictures
Solve missing number problems

GEOGRAPHY

Learning about different types of weather
Name, locate and label countries of the UK on a map
Use maps, atlases and globes to locate 'The Gambia' and learn about different countries of Africa
Comparing weather in the UK and Gambia
What type of clothes do we need for different types of weather and why?
Linking seasons and weather – what happens in autumn?

MUSIC

Use hands and voices to create different sounds
Learn the names and explore the sounds of different instruments
Learn songs to perform at the Harvest Celebration

ICT COMPUTING

To become familiar with using laptops and important keys on the keyboard e.g. shift, return, space bar, backspace
Learn how to log on and shut down the laptops safely
Develop mouse pad skills and use these to draw a picture

BRAIN AWARENESS WEEK (w.b. 22/10/18)

Begin to understand that our brain is made of brain cells which connect to each other when we learn new things
Learn about how our brains gather information using our five senses
Know that there are different learning styles (seeing, hearing and doing)
Play games to develop our memory skills
Learn how to look after our wonderful brains

SCIENCE

Identify, name, draw and label basic parts of the human body
Know which part of the body is associated with each sense
Use observational skills to notice similarities and differences between humans
Perform simple tests
Collect data to find answers to questions
Observe and discuss the change of season

PSHCE

(Personal, Social, Health and Citizenship Education)

Understand the school golden rules
Create and agree classroom rules
Play games to get to know one another and make new friends
Learn about different types of families
Begin to use targets to support our learning

RE

To know what celebration means and be able to express how this makes them feel
To know that festival days are celebrated by followers of religions
Experience a Harvest Festival
Discuss the key ideas about the Harvest celebration

ART

Using Africa as a stimulus for art work – explore a range of media and styles of art work to create
Use painting, drawing and collage to record our experiences of autumn

PE

Indoor – Gymnastics – developing balance, agility and co-ordination
Outdoor- safe use and awareness of space
Learn how to lead warm-up activities
To listen to, give and follow instructions
To watch and copy what others are doing
